- August is a heavy-on-planning but light-on-events month. Take a slow walking tour of your buildings and grounds. How can you clear-out and freshen up your paths, entryways and classrooms to make them more welcoming? Move passively accumulated boxes, tubs, literature, coat racks and furnishings to storage or donate them to local re-use collections.
- Update targeted mailing lists to send information and invitation to the upcoming program year. Focus your message to appeal directly to senior adults, families with kids, empty nesters and young adults, including opportunities for worship, formation, fellowship and outreach.

- September is light on liturgical observances. Consider using those Sundays to highlight various local ministries, including music, fellowship volunteers, the altar guild and others.
