## Saving Lives and Rebuilding Communities

Through Anglican and ecumenical partners, we are on the front lines within hours of a major disaster. **ERD saves lives by providing critical food, water and shelter to suffering people**.

Our rebuilding programs are a bridge to help people climb out of poverty. We build stronger communities that provide health care, food and housing.

In Iran, a devastating earthquake destroyed the ancient city of Bam, killing more than 45,000 people. Seventy percent of the city was destroyed, and tens of thousands were left homeless.

ERD responded immediately by providing emergency food, clean water, temporary shelter, medicine and personal care items to suffering children and families.

Currently, we are rebuilding homes and schools, repairing water systems, and providing trauma counseling and health care.

These little girls can smile today because compassionate people, like you, are helping them rebuild.



### **Providing Reliable Food Sources**

Finding food is a daily struggle for most people in our world. **ERD helps communities grow more food and sell their crops for income.** Our programs in food security fight poverty by giving families:

- enough food to eat year-round,
- better seeds, tools and training to improve their harvest,
- training and assistance to start small businesses.
- education to help people find jobs.

Your partnership helps families and communities break out of poverty. People earn an income so their families can live healthy and



In Madigo, one of the poorest communities in Uganda, ERD food security programs help people grow a year-round supply of food to sell and feed their families. For example, ERD provided oxen and plows to cultivate land. Food production will increase by at least 50 percent.

This young mother proudly displays her passion fruit harvest. With the money she earned, she can buy personal items like aspirin and toothpaste. She also purchased a rainwater collection system for her house. Now her family enjoys improved health through clean water. In her rural village, contaminated water is a major cause of disease and death.

Around the world, ERD saves lives by training health care workers and providing life-saving medicines. We help children and families live longer and healthier lives.


## Fighting HIV/AIDS and Caring for Its Victims

Nearly 30 million people in Africa are infected with HIV/AIDS. AIDS has orphaned more than 13 million children. The disease kills the most vulnerable — crippling communities and nations.

Fighting this pandemic in the hardest-hit countries in Africa, we provide:

- HIV/AIDS education and training to community leaders,
- support for orphans and other vulnerable children affected by AIDS,

care for people dying from AIDS through



Preventable diseases are killing children and vulnerable people in countries like El Salvador. We train health care workers like Heci Sulemi Garcia (on right) to provide medicines and teach mothers to care for their sick children.

"I see between 20 and 55 patients a day," Heci says proudly. "I feel good that I am able to save lives."

Our programs keep little girls, like the one above, healthy. We build clinics, supply critical medicines and train health care workers in communities around the world.


